What do we do in the war of the world, sit and hide? Or stay with the ones who died?

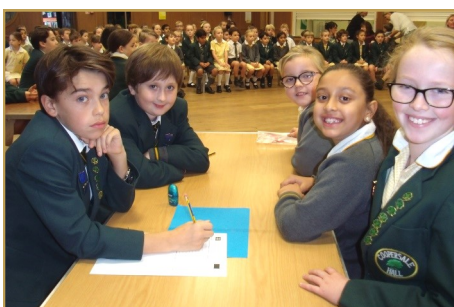
Every second, every minute of our lives there is something we can do, to help the lives in danger.

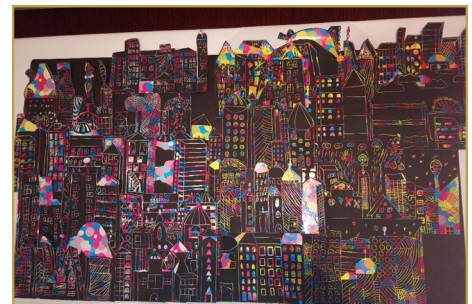
