Re: July 2021 Headmistress's Letter

In my final Headmistress's letter of the year, the first thing I want to do is thank all of our families for your support since September. Your support and understanding have made it far easier for us to navigate through a tricky year. Thank you!

I also wanted to thank all of the staff in school for their hard work and commitment this year. The maintenance team, the lunchtime supervisors, office staff, kitchen staff, support staff and teachers have all had to rethink everything we do to keep our children safe and happy. I am proud of what we achieved during such a difficult time.

PE Kits

After the success of having the children come to school in their PE kits on PE days, we have decided to trial continuing this arrangement in September. When we start the new academic year, children should come to school in their PE kits and stay in their PE kits on the days they have PE, unless there is a special event taking place during the day such as open mornings or school photographs, when parents will be advised in advance.

This is not the case for extra-curricular clubs. Children need to wear their full school uniform and change into PE kits after school on the days when they have a sports club.

Earrings

I want to thank parents for supporting us with our earrings policy this term. The policy had been in place at Coopersale Hall for some time, but had not been fully implemented previously. We have now reviewed the earrings policy across the Oak-Tree Group and made the decision that we will trial allowing Year 6 only to wear a plain stud earring in each ear to school on the days they don't have PE.

Earrings must be a small plain gold or silver stud. No other earrings will be allowed. It is important that parents realise that members of staff are not permitted to assist the pupils with the removal of earrings and the school can take no responsibility for any earrings that are brought on site.

No other year groups will be allowed to wear earrings in school, in line with the clear guidance provided by Essex County Council's Health & Safety Team. There used to be a practice of taping over earrings in some schools, but this was recently withdrawn and is no longer permitted.

May I therefore encourage any families who are considering ear piercing to use the long summer holiday so that ears are pierced early enough to allow the earrings to be removed by the time we return to school in September. There is usually a period of six weeks in which the earrings should remain in place after piercing. As no other year groups apart form Year 6 will be allowed to wear earrings after the summer break, please plan accordingly.

Pencil Cases and Equipment from Year 3

Pupils may bring their own small, plain pencil case into school from Year 3 upwards. The pencil case should fit easily into their school bag and be without any embellishments. Once a pupil has received their pen licence, we ask parents to buy Frixion blue erasable pens for their children to use in school. These pens are inexpensive and widely available online and in store.

Pupils might also like to have pencils, colouring pencils, a small ruler, eraser or highlighter. Pupils should not bring mathematical equipment including pairs of compasses into school nor pointed scissors.
