# **The Woodland Trust**

The school has ordered and received 30 saplings, including Wild Cherry, Rowan and Silver Birch from the Woodland Trust. The planting of the trees will count towards The Queen's Green Canopy, an initiative that marks The Platinum Jubilee of Elizabeth II. Following the death of Her Majesty the Queen, and the wishes of His Majesty the King, the initiative will give people the opportunity to plant trees in memoriam to honour The Queen. This will create a network of individual trees, avenues, copses and whole woodlands in honour of The Queen's service and the legacy she has built.

On 26 November the Eco Council and all of Year 6 planted their own trees. Children are being encouraged to name and care for their trees.

## Reading

The importance of reading for children cannot be underestimated. Reading for pleasure can benefit a child's education, social and cognitive development, wellbeing, and mental health. There is a relationship between reading and writing, with each one enriching the other. Therefore, we want to have a renewed focus on reading in school. A team of teachers will be running a Book Fair, Reading Workshop, Reading Buddies and a Readathon.

Please continue to set time aside every day for your child to read at home. It is vital that our children see you, as their parents, read for enjoyment so that they too can develop a love for reading.

#### **Book Fair**

From Thursday 2 to Wednesday 7 December, Coopersale Hall will be having a Book Fair organised by Travelling Books. The Book Fair will be open from 8.00 until 8.45am each day. On Friday Wednesday it will also be open in the afternoon from 3.00 to 4.00pm. The fair provides a good opportunity to purchase some quality reading books for the Christmas holidays, with prices ranging from £5 to £20.

In addition, Epping Bookshop is donating a percentage of the total sales to the school so that we can buy even more books. You can visit with or without your children. We will confirm the location daily by text; it will be either in the hall or studio to allow us to accommodate outdoor clubs, if the weather is poor.

Payment methods will be via a QR code which you can scan from your phone and then pay online there and then. We do hope that you will be able to support our Book Fair. It is a wonderful way of encouraging our children to read, supporting the school and our local independent bookshop.

## **Reading Workshop – Upper Kindergarten to Year 1 Parents**

On Tuesday 17 January from 8.40am to 9.30am, Miss Gilbert, our English Coordinator, along with some other class teachers will run a reading workshop for our families in the hall. The teachers will look at how to support your child at home and to instil a love for books from a young age. You will receive a text message in January to confirm your attendance. Please come along and find out how you can support this important foundation to learning.

## **Reading Buddies**

Over the years at Coopersale Hall we have had reading buddies once a half term. For those of you unfamiliar with the concept, each class in school will be paired with another class, the classes then get together and share a book with a friend in the other class. It is a lovely way to encourage reading across different year groups. For the remainder of the year, we will alternate reading buddies with the singing assembly every Wednesday. This will allow our children to read more in school and still enjoy singing with Mrs Jones.

## Maths Workshop – Reception Parents

Recently there have been a few changes to the EYFS curriculum for Maths and we would like to share how we are teaching the children. The workshop will take place on Tuesday 24 January 8.45am – 9.30am. During the session we will look at:

- What children are expected to be able to do by the end of Reception.
- Where you can expect to see maths being taught in EYFS
- Strategies that we use in school to support children with their mathematical understanding including:
  - $\circ~~$  5 and 10 frames
  - o Hungarian Model
  - Subitising
- Investigation and problem solving, number patterns and relationships
- Useful websites and resources

It would be wonderful to have parents at the workshop. Please look out for the text in January to confirm your attendance.

#### **Staff News**

The families in Reception will know from previous emails that Miss Smith begins maternity leave at the end of December. I am delighted to inform you that we have appointed Miss Sarah Greenin as the maternity cover for Miss Smith. Miss Greenin is an experienced teacher with a wealth of knowledge to benefit our children. She has taught at schools including St Aubyn's in Woodford and Kings College in Madrid, as well as spending two years as a class teacher at Avon House. Miss Greenin is well known to the Oak-Tree Group as she also spent two years teaching at Normanhurst alongside Miss Smith during my time as Head of Juniors. I know her well and we are confident that the transition for our children will be seamless.

Mrs Christine Greig will be stepping down as the piano teacher at the end of the term. Mrs Greig have been with us since 2016 and our children have enjoyed their piano lessons with her. Mrs Debbie Hoang will be joining the Coopersale Hall family in the Spring Term. Mrs Hoang is able to teach different genres of music from blues, to pop to classical to students age 4 and older. She is currently the Peripatetic Piano Teacher at Park School for Girls in Ilford. Mrs Hoang is looking forward to meeting your children.

#### **Snow and Wintry Weather**

Although a white Christmas is probably unlikely, we usually have snow at some point in the winter period. Our aim is always to stay open unless there is a health and safety concern in doing so. The maintenance team arrive on site early to clear paths and to make the site safe, and an update will be posted on the website by 7.00am so that parents are informed about arrangements for the day.

#### Earrings

We only have a three-week holiday at Christmas, which does not provide enough time for you to have your children's ears pierced before we return to school and any earrings have to be removed. As you know, only Year 6 pupils are allowed to wear earrings for school at Coopersale Hall School. They are not permitted in PE lessons, where they present a health and safety concern, even if taped, nor in the normal school day. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in this.
