Year 6 Get Creative With Batik Art

Year 6 children at Coopersale Hall have been doing batik work using the work of Romero Britto as the stimulus for their work. They worked hard to try and make their designs big and bold without too much detail. Children chose a variety of different birds as their templates - and then added lines and dots to make their work more interesting.

Using hot paraffin wax, poured into a tjanting tool, children traced over their bird designs. The steadier their hands, the cleaner the lines they created. They needed to work quickly to ensure that not too much wax was absorbed into the calico. It was also important that the wax wasn't too cold so that the wax lines were thick enough to form a barrier and absorb the dye when they later painted and sponged their designs.

Once the wax had dried, children mixed their own colours and created bright, bold designs. We're very impressed with how their pieces have turned out.

Year 1 really enjoyed Show and Tell, bringing in something special to them or something educational and explaining why they had brought it to show the class.

Pupil Spotlight

This month we are shining the pupil spotlight on Abigail in Year 5, who is an avid golf fan and player. Abigail sat down with us to share the news of her recent competition and what the sport really means to her.

Abigail - Golf Questions:

What was the Tournament called?

First Aid Training in Year 6

On Wednesday the 1 March, Year 6 children all attended First Aid Training. They learned all about DR. ABC, how to assess whether someone needs help and how urgent the situation is. Using the resuscitation manikins, the children also learned how to do CPR. They needed to compress really quickly and with more force than they expected.

Pupils also learned about the possible reasons for people to stop breathing and how to help them if they do. They can now confidently put a casualty into the recovery position and know how to help them if they are unresponsive.

In addition to this, the children also learned about other first aid emergencies and how to help someone with various types of burns, cuts and choking. They particularly enjoyed dislodging objects that someone might be choking on using the abdominal thrust on the manikins.

They asked some excellent questions and showed great maturity in dealing with a range of different first aid situations. Well done Year 6, you all deserve your 'Mini First Aid' certificates.



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World Book Day at Coopersale Hall

On Monday 13 March and Tuesday 14 March, half of Year 6 did their Bikeability, and the other half did it on Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March.

In the morning we practised turning, hand signals and basic cycling on the astro-turf. At the beginning of the lesson, we fitted our helmets and did our ABCD check:

A = Air in tyres. B = Brakes. C= Chains in gears. D = Direction of handle bars.

After lunch we cycled down Flux's Lane and started to cycle in the roads. We learned about positions in the road and how to do a U-turn. Eventually we ran out of time, so we cycled back to school to put our bikes away until our next session.

The next day, we went straight onto the roads, practising previous activities to warm up and then how to cycle past a simple T-junction. After the tiring morning, we refreshed ourselves with some well-deserved snacks!

Once our break ended, we peddled up the road, practising traffic diversion, traffic lights, turning in to junctions and more U-turns.

The Benefits of Yoga For Children

Yoga lessons are taught to all of our Kindergarten children from the first term they start at school. The children enjoy getting the chance to move their bodies and concentrate on their movements.

At the start of every lesson the children sit in a circle and listen to Miss Dawson, their Yoga teacher, ask them the question "what do you love?", the children take it in turns to knock the chimes and answer. Its always interesting to hear the children's answers, some saying "I love baked beans" and "I love my teddy" but the most common answer is often "I love my mummy playing with me." Every child has the opportunity to ring the chimes and have everyone listen to their answer.

These lessons help the children with social skills, encourages good team work and teaches them to have respect for one another as well as increasing their confidence. The children follow Miss Dawson and hold the poses that she models for them at the front of the class. The exercise improves muscle strength and helps to enhance concentration. hey are also helping to maintain their flexibility, body awareness, balance and co-ordination.

At the end of every class Miss Dawson repeats kind words of affirmation that the children join in with. I am Kind, Caring, Loving...

There are so many benefits to Yoga for children, it can support their mental health and wellbeing and help to focus the mind. In our busy, constantly stimulated world it can be really hard for children to find ways to switch off and calm down. Yoga provides a space where they can do this - without judgement or expectation.

It's important to teach children how to relax, how to breath, how to release tension in the body through simple stretches and how to focus and calm the mind. Giving them the skills to be able to deal with anxiety or stress.
