This activity combined a fun practical task of sandwich making whilst still learning important aspects of grammar such as imperative (bossy) verbs and writing a non fiction text instructions. The children learnt to include bullet points, numbers or time connectives to identify the correct order, a heading and sub headings to ensure the reader knows what the instructions are about. 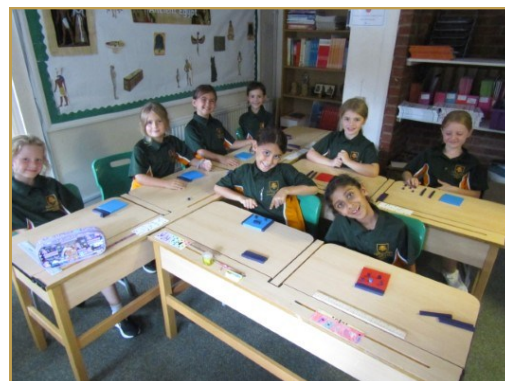
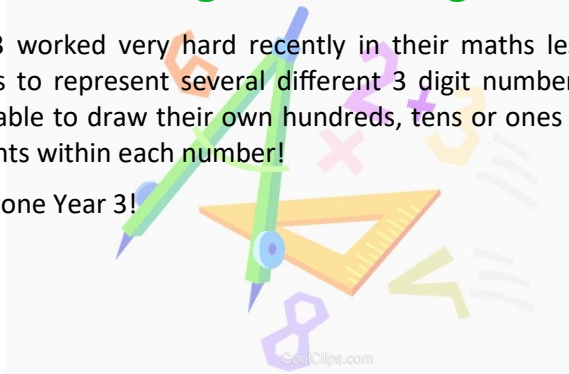
