Re: October 2023 Headmistress's Letter

I hope your children have enjoyed the first few weeks of term, particularly if you joined us for the first time in September. It has been lovely to see how well the children have settled into their new classes.

We have already had a busy few weeks with lots of exciting lessons, learning outside of the classroom and several school trips and visits including Reception's visit to Willow's Farm, Year 5's trip to Harlow Outdoor Pursuits. We have also enjoyed our first residential trip of the year: Year 3 camp at Oaklands School. This was a wonderful opportunity for the children to be working together and with the other Year 3 children across the Oak-Tree Group.

GENERAL

Change of Contact Details

Please inform the office if any of your contact details have changed so that we can contact you as necessary.

Car Parks

Please reduce your speed when approaching the school on our driveway and drive carefully in our car parks. We have seen some cars driving very quickly with young children walking nearby. Our maintenance team helps with parking - please take note of their directions, and be considerate of other cars and do not block them in. If you are using the "Drop Off" lane, please do so as swiftly as possible to avoid causing congestion.

We will be encouraging all of the children from Year 2 upwards to use the "Drop Off" lane after October Half Term. Not only does this encourage independence but it also means less traffic in the morning. You would have seen a member of SLT on duty at the gates every morning to make sure your children feel comfortable in making their way to their classes. It is wonderful to see older siblings walking their younger siblings to their classes in the morning.

Lost Property

We have quite a lot of lost property building up in the area beside the hall in the courtyard. Could I please ask you to come and have a check if you have lost anything, in case it is there. Anything not claimed will be sorted out and moved by Thursday 5 October.

Jewellery

Please note that earrings are not permitted at school, with the exception of Year 6 and Year 7 pupils, who are permitted to wear a small plain silver or gold stud on non-PE days. We would advise that ears should be pierced at the beginning of the summer holiday so that the ear studs/rings can be removed easily when school begins in September. No earrings are permitted for any sporting activities or clubs.

Staffing Update

As many of you may know, Miss Smith has been on maternity leave since January 2023. She has now made the difficult decision not to return to Coopersale Hall, as she would like to spend more time with her son. I am pleased to inform you that Mrs Haq, who is currently teaching Reception Smith, will continue as the children's class teacher for the remainder of this academic year. Mrs Haq has settled in very well at Coopersale Hall and has already formed excellent relationships with our children, parents and staff. We are fortunate to have secured such an experienced teacher and I am pleased that there will be no interruption to the children's learning in Reception.

Oak-Tree Challenge

Mrs Bull has introduced the ever-popular Oak-Tree Challenge Scheme to our pupils from Years 4-6 in an assembly last week. This is a successful initiative that provides our children with an incentive to participate in the huge variety of opportunities both inside and outside of school. The scheme runs throughout the year and children receive awards for their participation at the end of the summer term.

The Oak-Tree Scheme is voluntary and pupil-initiated. Some challenges are achievable in school time, others are designed to be undertaken out of school with parental support. Throughout the nine challenges, there is a mixture of skills and activities being assessed, including voluntary work and independent study.

For each stage there is a requirement for self-reflection that is intended to become more detailed as the children get older. Evidence of the successful completion of challenges will be recorded in a logbook that must be kept upto-date and completed by the pupils themselves. The supervising teacher, parent or other adult should countersign the relevant journal entry to verify the contents.

Bronze and Silver Award certificates will be presented in the final assemblies at the end of each academic year, and Gold Award certificates will be presented at each Speech Day and Prize Giving. All pupils who gain an award will also receive a pin badge to wear on their lapel. The Awards will be entered onto the pupils' permanent records and may be referred to in future references.

We hope that all children will choose to participate and enjoy the challenges and personal success that they will bring to them.

Open Morning

Our Open Morning for prospective and current parents is on Tuesday, 10 October from 9.15am. Please let the office know if you would like to come along and see the school at work and refresh your memories of areas of the school with which you may be less familiar. This will also be an opportunity to tour our new Senior School and we would particularly encourage our Year 5 and 6 parents to come along. Children from Years 6 & 7 will act as the official guides and are very excited to showcase our school to you.

Parents' Association

The Friends of Coopersale Hall School (FoCHS) are holding their AGM on Friday 13 October at 8.45am in the Studio. We are fortunate to have an extremely active Parents' Association, with a team of volunteers who work extremely hard to organise events and to enhance the children's experiences in school. Remembrance Sunday

Years 5 & 6 have been invited to attend the annual Remembrance Parade in Epping and lay a wreath on behalf of Coopersale Hall School on Sunday 12 November. Timings were on the letter sent out, please reply to the text back if you have not done so already.

Oak-Tree Fireworks

We are delighted to be holding the annual Oak-Tree Fireworks event again this year, on Sunday 5 November from 4.30pm to 6.45pm, in the grounds of Oaklands School. Tickets for this popular event in the Oak-Tree Group's calendar are available to families from all four schools. All profits from the evening will go back to the Parents' Associations, with the teams from the four schools joining together to help run the event.

Due to the enormous demand, tickets will only be available to purchase before the event. Ticket sales will be limited to around 1000. Tickets will cost £7 per child or £14 per adult with a discounted price of £38 for a family of two children and two adults. This includes a hot dog (meat or vegetarian), with additional treats for children. There will be opportunities to purchase mulled wine, beer, hot drinks and various children glow goodies during the evening. The pre-fireworks live music will be provided by pupils from across the four schools, and there will be entertainment for the children.

Parents' Evenings - Whole School

Formal Parents' Evenings will be held after half term on Tuesday 14 November and Wednesday 15 November. You will be able to book your appointment on your child's portal on Monday 16 October. We will send out a text when this goes live. Our specialist subject teachers will also be available to speak with parents for the following subjects: Music, Science, PE, Computer, French on Tuesday 14 November in the hall. No appointment necessary, please turn up to see those specialist teachers.

Mild Illness and School Attendance

The Government has published some guidance for parents about school attendance if their children are slightly unwell, which is based on advice from Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer, as well as other eminent medical professionals.

The guidance says that it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above.

The guidance also offers advice for parents whose children who may feel anxious about coming to school: guidance on mental health issues affecting a pupil's attendance.
